The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 19, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Pennsylvania State University, following up on an initial telephone report on March 29, 2017. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that several live newborn mice were found in the carcass freezer due to a failure to use the required secondary physical method of euthanasia to ensure death following exposure to CO2.

The corrective actions consisted of retraining the Principal Investigator and staff, ensuring that new laboratory staff is appropriately trained on euthanasia, and having new staff work with experienced staff when conducting euthanasia and ensuring death.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The Pennsylvania State University, in accordance with Assurance A3141-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance regarding the Principle Investigator's (PI) failure to ensure death of animals after euthanasia procedures. The activities were associated with a protocol that is supported by PHS funds. This incident was reported to the IACUC on March 27, 2017 and was reported to you via telephone call on March 29, 2017.

On March 27, an Animal Resource Program (ARP) technician reported concerns related to failure to ensure death of animals after euthanasia procedures. Specifically, the technician uncovered a small bag of "pinkies" found alive in a facilities freezer. After investigation, it was determined a researcher in the PI's lab did not follow the required secondary method of decapitation following CO₂ exposure, as required in the protocol.

To address the situation, the IACUC took corrective actions, which included:

- 1. The PI and the research team will retake CITI training, working with mice in research.
- 2. The PI must present to the IACUC a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) for ensuring future lab members are appropriately trained on approved methods of euthanasia and on the difference between euthanasia and anesthesia.

The PI and lab personnel completed their training as required and submitted their CAP plan by June 1, 2017. This plan included:

- 1. All new lab members will be required to read through and understand approved methods of euthanasia on the investigators protocols.
- 2. All new lab members will work with senior members of the lab to perform the euthanasia process according to the approved methods of the investigators protocols.

3. New lab members will be made aware that since the purpose of euthanization is to put animals to death while anesthesia is not, confirmation of the death with a required secondary method will be needed for any euthanization process.

As this non-compliance occurred prior to assignment of animals to a research protocol, no unallowable costs were charged to the NIH grant at issue in this incident of noncompliance. The Pennsylvania State University is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and appreciates the guidance and assistance provided by OLAW in this regard.
