Dear Dr. Saunders,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your December 12, 2018 letter reporting several instances of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Drexel University, following up on an initial telephone report on November 19, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) identified six laboratories with expired analgesics/anesthetics or containers with labels with no expiration date. The drug containers were mingled with in-date drugs. One laboratory was supported by NSF grant #1751898.

The corrective actions consisted of removing the expired agents. A new policy was implemented whereby expired or improperly labeled analgesics/anesthetics will result in the Principal Investigator submitting quarterly inventory reports of such drugs to the IACUC.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to address this problem. While OLAW concurs with the actions taken thus far by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy, this remedy could still lead to use of expired analgesics/anesthetics with potential negative animal welfare effects. Other institutions facing a similar problem have instituted color coded marking systems and appointing a laboratory member to check expiration dates monthly. Some institutions maintain an electronic inventory which is checked monthly to allow timely removal of expired drugs. Ongoing violations have resulted in personnel actions for the individuals responsible for monitoring and placing the laboratory on direct enhanced post-approval monitoring by the IACUC. Please inform OLAW if the noncompliance persists and/or if additional measures have been taken to prevent recurrence. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Drexel University, in accordance with Assurance D16-00138 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report of noncompliance of analgesic and anesthetic drugs found in working stock during IACUC semi-annual inspections which had expired or lacked a clear expiration date. Five out of the six individual laboratories which were identified are currently supported with PHS and NSF funding. The work performed is supported by NIH grant award numbers AI136716-01, 4U01HL116556-04, 5R01MH85666, 152732/R01NS041596, and NSF award number 1751898.

During the fall 2018 IACUC semi-annual inspections, six individual laboratories contained one or more anesthetic or analgesic drugs which had either expired or did not have a clear expiration date label. These expired or unlabeled anesthetics or analgesics were located within working drug stock.

Each instance was identified as a significant deficiency and required removal of the noted drug from working stock within 24 hours. In two laboratories, the investigators removed the drugs at the time of the inspection. In the remaining laboratories, the Principal Investigator responded to a written notification and stated that the drugs had been removed from the working stock within the required time.

On 11/14/2018, a subset of the IACUC met to conduct the semi-annual program review and determined that though procedures were in place to ensure analgesics and anesthetics are used within the expiration date, the current program needed to be improved. A regularly convened IACUC meeting occurred subsequent to the program review. During the meeting, the IACUC discussed the current analgesic and anesthetic monitoring program and voted to approve the following plan of action:

• The Office of Research will notify OLAW of the deficiencies related to expired analgesics and anesthetics found during the fall 2018 semi-annual inspections.

- A new policy will be established where, if expired or improperly labeled anesthetic or analgesic drugs are found during an announced inspection, the Principal Investigator must submit quarterly inventory reports of all anesthetic and analgesic drug stock to the IACUC for a minimum of one year. The quarterly report policy will apply to the laboratories identified during the fall 2018 semi-annual inspections. The IACUC chair will inform all Principal Investigators of the violation and this new policy.
- The IACUC chair will notify those Principle Investigators which had expired or missing expiration labels of anesthetic or analgesic drugs found during the fall 2018 semi-annual inspections and inform them of the above policy. The chair will also reinforce the severity of using expired analgesic and anesthetics.

Drexel University is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and appreciates the guidance and assistance provided by OLAW in this regard. 
