Part 3 of the Assurance Statement of APHIS Form 7023 (AUG 91) (Section 2.36 (b)(3) of the Animal Welfare Act): IACUC Approved Exceptions to Standards and/or Regulations

Approved exceptions to standards and regulations of the Act during the reporting period included the following:

Exception to 3.131 (a) (other warm-blooded animals): Cleaning Schedule

The IACUC approved one protocol with an exception to the cleaning schedule. During this period, 66 tuco-tucos were used under this exception.

Justification: The exception for cleaning primary enclosures that house warm-blooded animals reflects both the biology of these animals and the goals of the associated research project. Tuco-tucos rely heavily on olfactory cues to maintain social relationships. Frequent cleaning of animal housing disrupts those cues, thereby potentially impacting social interactions. The goal of these studies is to document the social behavior of this species. Sanitation leads to observable changes in behavior (e.g., excessive urination at tunnel junctions to re-establish scent marks) and thus impacts data collection. The current cleaning schedule (every 6-8 weeks) has been used for many years with no apparent negative consequences to animal health or welfare.

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
