Dear Dr. Cate,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your June 20, 2018 letter reporting an adverse event involving a research mouse at Indiana University- Bloomington, following up on an initial telephone report on June 15, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a new student was transferring mice from a behavior chamber to their home cage when one animal tried to jump out. The student caught the mouse but unintentionally squeezed it and the animal died.

The corrective actions consisted of counseling the laboratory staff on how to handle mouse escapes, training the student on mouse behavior, and having the veterinarian recommend refinements to the chamber to minimize escapes.

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Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to reduce the likelihood of a recurrence of this type of accident. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

Dear Dr. Morse:

This letter reports a new incident of noncompliance with the PHS Policy and an unanticipated adverse animal event at the Indiana University Bloomington campus. This event occurred in one research laboratory. A verbal, preliminary report was given to Dr. Axel Wolff on June 15, 2018.

On June 12, 2018, a laboratory using purpose-bred mice reported an unanticipated animal death to animal care staff. The clinical veterinarian spoke with the individuals involved and provided the following information. A new student with the laboratory was being trained by the laboratory manager. Mice were being used in an IACUC-approved activity, which involved transferring the animals from a behavioral chamber to their home cages. When the lab manager stepped away from the room briefly, the student unintentionally and inadvertently injured one mouse as it appeared to be preparing to jump out of the chamber before being transferred to its home cage. The mouse died as a result.

The student continues to express remorse, noting that his intention was to catch the mouse before it leapt and landed on the floor. The PI and lab manager will meet with all laboratory personnel to discuss this event and review appropriate actions to take if an animal escapes. The clinical veterinarian met with the student and reviewed mouse behavior. She also evaluated the chamber and has suggested additional refinements that may aid in minimizing the potential for escape.

As a significant portion of the IACUC membership is on travel during the month of June, the details of this event have been shared via email. Members who have responded are in agreement with categorizing this as an unanticipated adverse animal event.


