Cats underwent onychectomy (declaw) of the front limbs. The two cats were documented as being reluctant to place weight on their front paws.

The intent of the study was to investigate the pain relieving efficacy of two compounds in cats undergoing onychectomy. Procedures were in place to minimize pain and discomfort if necessary, which included administration of analgesics. The pain levels experienced, however, did not exceed the established pain threshold set forth in the protocol to warrant additional analgesics.

Though the FDA does not require this procedure perse, compounds must show efficacy in relevant preclinical studies. Onychectomy was chosen as it is a very common and often painful procedure, regularly conducted in cats. Oncychectomy was chosen over other more invasive procedures, such as ovariohysterectomy, which would require longer surgical and recovery periods.
