The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 21, 2017 letter reporting the suspension of an animal activity at the University of California- San Diego, following up on an initial telephone report on July 18, 2017. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) took this action after determining that a Principal Investigator (PI) euthanized neonatal mouse pups by an unapproved method. The pups were needed as embryos but were unintentionally born because the dams were not being monitored.

The corrective actions consisted of the IACUC requiring the PI to obtain a letter of support from the Department Chairperson endorsing reinstatement of animal use privileges, a description of oversight of animal activities, and if acceptable to the IACUC a new protocol outlining monitoring of the pregnant mice and approved euthanasia in case of unintended births.

OLAW understands that the protocol involved was not PHS-supported, but concurs that the incident was serious and supports the actions taken by the IACUC. The establishment and application of policies and practices that are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California- San Diego are commendable and avoid the perception of a double standard. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Dear Dr. Wolff,

Per PHS Policy IV.F.3, I am writing to advise you of an incidence of serious noncompliance and subsequent suspension of a UC San Diego Principal Investigator's mouse protocol. The suspension was due to the Principal Investigator's description of an unapproved method to euthanize neonatal mouse pups, which were unintentionally born as a result of lack of monitoring of his pregnant female mice used to create mouse embryonic fibroblasts.

Before the suspension may be lifted, the Principal Investigator must provide a letter of support from his Department Chairperson endorsing his reinstatement of animal use privileges and detailing oversight measures that will be enacted to prevent further violations of animal care standards. If the IACUC receives and accepts such an assurance, he will be allowed to submit a new protocol to the IACUC to describe his proposed research and address specifically how he will prevent accidental births from occurring if he intends to generate mouse embryonic fibroblasts. He will also need to include an AVMA-approved method of euthanasia of the neonatal pups in the event that his plan of preventing live births fails.
