The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your November 21, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Emory University, following up on an initial report on October 31, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that expired controlled drugs were used during rodent surgeries.

The corrective actions consisted of counseling the laboratory staff, stopping surgeries until in-date drugs were obtained, discarding expired drugs, and modifying the drug log to clearly identify when drugs will expire.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy. In future reports, please clearly state the species involved and the type of drug (i.e., anesthetic/analgesic). Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

The Emory University Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC), through the Institutional Official, is reporting the results of an event as required by section IV, F, 3a of the *Public Health Service Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* (PHS Policy). A preliminary report was provided via email to your office on October 31, 2019. This is the final report regarding the use of expired controlled substances during surgeries. The associated NIH-funded grants are R01 CA202846-04 and U01CA19891301.

Situation and Assessment

On July 9, 2019 during a semi-annual site inspection, it was discovered that a lab was using expired controlled substances for surgeries.

The corrective actions to prevent recurrences are detailed as follows:

- The lab was coached on site by EU DAR vet staff about animal welfare concerns of using expired agents for surgeries.
- The lab was told not to perform any surgeries until more controlled substances could be purchased.
- 3. The lab used a reverse distributor to have the expired reagent shipped back to the company for disposal.
- 4. The lab is currently using up to date-controlled substances for surgeries.
- The lab has modified their drug usage log to better recognize when drugs will expire.

The IACUC believes its investigation of this incident was thorough and the corrective actions appropriate to prevent a similar occurrence. If you have questions regarding this incident, please contact me or Dr. David Martin, Director, IACUC Office.
