She has provided some excellent feedback on study protocols since she joined the IACUC committee this spring. I think it will also be a great opportunity for her to observe animal care and husbandry at a different facility. She could also fill out a post-approval monitoring summary for the egret project while she is there. I believe the egrets are on (b)(5).
