
The Animal Care and Use Review Office recommends continued funding of the supported animal research to appropriate Department of Defense agencies.

- e. The IACUC had developed an IACUC training tracking sheet that adequately lists all required IACUC training as outlined in the IACUC function policy. However, documentation on the tracking sheets were incomplete for multiple IACUC members. It was difficult to determine if some IACUC members had completed their training requirements. Also, some training certificate dates did not match their respective training completion dates on the IACUC training tracking sheet. Recommend accurate documentation on the IACUC training tracking sheet to correctly reflect each individual's training record. *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, Eighth Edition, Chapter 2, Page 15, "should".*
- i. No welfare concerns were reported for DoD-funded projects; however, concerns reported on non-DoD-funded studies are thoroughly discussed in IACUC minutes and appear to be well investigated by the Committee.
